Anderson called meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

1. Interviews for Advisory Boards

The Council interviewed the following candidates for service on Minnetonka advisory boards:

Sue Woodrich: An eight-year resident of the city, Sue has worked with the YWCA, the University of Minnesota, and Hennepin Parks during her 25-year career. At Hennepin Park, she served as a research assistant, managed the Northern Division, and then became Director. She now would like to be involved in parks and recreation in a more civic-minded way. Sue would consider serving on another board or commission, but, since her skills and knowledge relate directly with parks and recreation, she is most comfortable serving on the Park Board.

Joseph Steen: A 35-year resident, Joseph's background included 42 years as a rehab psychologist. He is involved with the scouting program and active with the Optimists Club. He was also involved with Juvenile Diversion. He is interested in serving on the Senior Advisory Board as well as the Park Board and the Police Advisory Committee. He stated he would like to help improve the status of life for people. He is not available Monday or Tuesday.

(Anderson thanked Joseph for his contributions to the community; he volunteered for, and recruited volunteers for, Juvenile Diversion.)

Ruby Berg: A 32-year resident, Ruby has volunteered as an election judge for the city since her retirement from Wells Fargo. She has a background in banking. She would like to serve on the Senior Advisory Board. Currently she works with Wells Fargo retirees (aprox. 1000), which involves four meetings per year. She has been president and on the council with this group.

(Anderson asked if Ruby would be interested in the Community Heritage Commission since Ruby has also worked on the Wells Fargo museum).
