Subject: Massage Ordinance Amendments

At the suggestion of Council Member Hiller, staff is recommending that a change be made to §810.055 (1)(a). The proposed ordinance currently requires the massage business to provide information about their massage therapists at the time of license renewal. The change would require the business to also keep the information in their files and to provide it to the city upon request. This would allow the city access to the information during a license year if an issue arises. The change to the proposed section would be:

a. ~~In each application for a license renewal, the licensee must list all people providing massages on the licensed premises. The applicant must also include information establishing that each person providing massages meets the definition of a massage therapist in section 810.005, a signed and notarized acknowledgement from each massage therapist that he or she has read and understands the requirements of this section 810, and a list of any convictions related to prostitution or violations of massage regulations for each of the massage therapists. When hiring or contracting with a massage therapist, the licensee must (1) document that the person meets the definition of a massage therapist in section 810.005, (2) obtain from each massage therapist a signed and notarized acknowledgement that he or she has read and understands the requirements of this section 810, and (3) obtain a list of any convictions that the massage therapist has that are related to prostitution or violations of massage regulations. The licensee must maintain this information in its records and must provide the information for all massage therapists to the city whenever it is requested and as part of its annual license renewal. Failure to provide complete and timely information will subject the licensee to the penalties provided in this code and to potential denial of a renewed license.~~
